Hey, as I mentioned last month, I enjoy a good scare, too, reading Stephen King, watching Alfred Hitchcock, listening to Alice Cooper.

But the month of November truly begins my favorite time of year, as well as containing two of my personal favorite holidays left (the top two on the American poll): #2. Thanksgiving and #1. Christmas. I mean, c'mon, stuffing yourself with turkey and all the trimmings until the tryptophan carries you away into sofa slumber. What's not to like? Your assignment will begin on November 22^{nd} , with a reading of Day #1 along with its practice, and you'll continue each day until our first-class discussion together on Monday, November 29^{th} , here at the church, from 7:00 – 8:00 p.m.

I hope you'll join us as we prepare our hearts for the celebration of America's (and mine) favorite holiday/holyday of the year.

You will need to create a digital account by going to www.KingSoopers.com/CommunityRewards.

You will then select **Create an Account**. Under sign-in information, enter your email and create a password (write down your password, you will need it in step 2). Select 'Use Card Number' and enter your SooperCard Number or Alternate ID, last name and zip code. Under 'Select your Store', enter your zip code and then select 'Find Stores'. Choose your store and then select 'Create Account'. Once you get the welcome email, then you can go back in clicking on the link in the email and finish creating your account. Then click on the Community Rewards link on the left hand side and either search by Green Mountain United Methodist Church or use this number to find us: RK117, which is our organization code. 

The Cedarhill Community Garden at GMUMC needs your leaves!

Before just bagging up those leaves and tossing them- seriously consider blowing or raking them into your mixed perennial and/or vegetable beds or mulching them into your lawn. And...if you have extra bags of leaves, please leave the bags in the Garden on the east side of the new shed by the compost bins. The gardeners will make good use of them in the next few weeks. You may want to follow our example in your own garden after reading below what we will be doing with your leaves.

For you fellow veggie gardeners, to prepare your soil for next year, rake in several inches of leaves and then spade over and leave rough, then spread more laves on top and lightly cover with soil. This is a form of sheet composting (for you that need to know), and I believe it was invented for lazy gardeners (like me). That's why I use it, but what's the prob – it works! The freeze/thaw cycle that we experience many times in the winter will break down those large rough pieces and at the same time, the leaves will decompose or at least partially, making the soil lighter and richer. Peace to all and to the gardens, a good winter's sleep.
