"It's been a long, cold, lonely winter," in the words of the late Beatle, George Harrison... but "here comes the sun!" Yes, the celebration of Easter is just a couple of weeks away- when, just as the devil thought he had his claws on the crucified and buried Jesus, God triumphantly raised him from the dead. Another minister friend of mine likes to say God got the last laugh! So, in anticipation of the joy and laughter to come, chasing away the gloomy shadows of Lent, I'd like to share with you one of the funniest moments I think I've ever experienced in ministry; and it happened about this time of year during my very first appointment in the tiny town of Como, Texas. Hopkins County, in the Northeast part of the Lone Star state, has been historically dry, meaning the prohibition of the sale of alcohol. You couldn't buy a single can of PBR at the Piggly Wiggly or a convenience gas station or even at the few cafes down the road in larger Sulphur Springs if you tried. But Como happened to be on the fringe of Hopkins County, just a few miles from the border of the neighboring county to the west that did sell spirits; and received quite a brisk business from a number of the town's residents. Including a few of the members of the Methodist congregation I pastored.

One evening, I received a call at the parsonage from a person requesting an order of various libations for a pickup, and I happened to recognize the voice as belonging to one of my congregants. Seems the phone number to the liquor store was similar to the one at the parsonage, and she had simply misdialled. 'Mary,' I asked, 'is that you?' There was silence for a moment, and then she replied (using the preferred title of pastors there and then), 'Brother Mark? Is that you?' 'Yep, it surely is, Mary.' I awaited an embarrassed apology. But Mary replied, instead, 'What are YOU doing at the liquor store!'

I hope, in addition to Easter Sunday on April 17, you will also join us for the following Sunday, April 24, for a special worship service of Holy Humor, M.C.-ed by our own Rich and Jean Arnold, and Karlynn Cory. I'd refer to them as Green Mountain's 3 Stooges, but Jean and Karlynn are just too smart. Prayer Journey for Lent – Virtual Upper Room

What will you give up for Lent? *How about 50 minutes of sleep once a week for 6 weeks? What new spiritual practice will you explore? How about simplicity? Watching the sunrise on a new day? How about giving up fear and moving to trust?*

This season, as we emerge from COVID (and learn to live with the ever-present virus and uncertainty), we will learn to move from Fear to Trust and from *perceived* Chaos to Simplicity. Jesus said: *"For where two or three gather in my name, there am I with them."* Matthew 18:20 NIV.

Grab a cup of coffee (or tea) and join me weekly during the six weeks of Lent to dedicate ourselves to a time of prayer and meditation. **For six (6) Wednesday mornings at 6:05 a.m. during Lent: March 9 through April 13**, we will gather in our *virtual upper room* to pray and share stories both biblical and personal – of sorrow, fear, reflection, and joy. We will use *The Upper Room* as our guide. **You will find free copies of *The Upper Room in the narthex*.** The Upper Room is also available, free online at that the following link:

If you cannot commit to all six weeks, please join when you can. The call is free, and our prayer and meditation time will last for about 50 minutes.

From the Trustees: Live Streaming of 10:30 Service

Our 10:30 a.m. Service is now live streamed to watch on **YouTube** or **Facebook**. Over the next few weeks, the production will be fine-tuned as we evaluate and improve the format. We have two cameras, one over the rear door and one to the right of the sound booth. They are operated remotely by a technician in California. The company we have contracted with, **Live Control**, is sent the Sunday bulletin information so they know where and when to aim the cameras appropriately. The announcements and the words to hymns and prayers are projected onto the walls by our sound booth operator and are also streamed.

In addition to Sunday service, we have the option to stream private events such as a memorial service or wedding. These events are password protected so only those receiving the link can view. This capability is especially nice for those out-of-town relatives and friends unable to attend in person.

Search YouTube or Facebook to find our live stream or watch later if you aren't available on Sunday at 10:30. A big thanks to Ron and Jane Bernard whose expertise have gotten the streaming project underway and installed. Also, Calvin Mukarakate and Vince Allen have added to the effort. And...if you would like to join the sound booth team, please let Mark or Ron Bernard know. We could use a few more folks to join in the operator rotation.

Spring is the time for our annual spring plant sale – along with the choirs. So, watch for more information to come in April. Visit the shade pergola and sit in the waking garden and watch for those early signs of spring. The pollinator garden is filled with perennials, and you can observe nature's progress. All are invited to come into the garden for a respite and to just *be* – *no matter the season*.

Garden plots. If you would like a garden plot for the 2022 growing season, please contact co-garden leader **Ali Young** (mustang.ali@hotmail.com) to be added to the wait list. Once the wait list reaches 10 people, we will close the list until the 2023 growing season. We expect to have 2-4 plots available in the 2022 season. Ali is coordinating garden plot assignments.

What we need:

- **Garden tools** – As you start working in your own garden – or you are downsizing – please think of the Garden and donate your used hand tools, rakes, shovels, wheelbarrows, etc. Any extra tools will be donated to DUG for other Community Gardens this spring.
- **Bricks** – The brick ongoing fund raiser. We anticipate installing the bricks in the spring/summer now that the fencing, compost bins and shade pergola are in (see below). **Denver Urban Gardens (DUG) Construction.** The bricks will be installed by a professional contractor, who met with Jean Arnold in August 2021. And we can continue to install bricks where we have blanks into the future.

Each volunteer needs to take a *Safeguarding God's Children* course, that I can lead and present.

We want the children to be excited to come and be a part of the community of Green Mountain United Methodist Church. Please volunteer some names to me, or even yourself! No person is too old or not experienced enough! You will not be left alone with the children. If you want to come and read a story to the children, play a game, or lead a craft that would be very much appreciated!

I always try to use the children's names so that everyone knows our youngest members... but I need your help, please come, and show them who you are!

I discovered that we still have some money left from our fundraising and are being gifted some funds donated by Coralie Brown to renovate the classrooms! I am going to gather some parents to discuss items to purchase some things that will entice and encourage children to come to church.
