Mark's Musings

I had an intensely serious seminary professor of systematic theology who once asked me, "Mr. Thurman, I think you need to choose what profession you wish to pursue: comedy or ministry." I replied, "Why can't I do both?" I somehow managed to pass that class anyway and went on to graduate. And I believe I have managed to comfortably and (mostly) appropriately merge the two. So, it's no surprise that I enjoy regular viewings of stand-up comedians performing live on Netflix: Oswald Patton, Maria Banford, Dave Chapell, Wanda Sykes, Jim Gaffigan, Brian Regan... I could go on and on. Most recently, I watched a new special from the comedian, Jeff Foxworthy, his first solo in 24 years. You might know him as the fella with the tag line, "You know you're a redneck if..." On this most current special, he's celebrating his status as a new grandfather and entering now into his senior years becoming naturally a little nostalgic of what he calls 'The good ol' days.' For example, he jokes, 'Remember the good ol' days when you played sports in school but if you wanted a trophy you had to finish in first place?'

The reason I'm bringing this up is that I have a box of about 50 or so remaining Compact Discs (do you remember the good ol' days of CDs?) of a recording I made with a fellow minister friend of mine who accompanies me on piano and guitar while I sing some of my favorite hymns and church songs. It's called *A Life in the Day*, a musical reflection of the Christian spiritual journey from birth/baptism to life, and death, and life beyond. Ten songs, some newer and some old classics. It was recorded almost 25 years ago in a recording studio in the tiny town of Farmersville, Texas, and has a photo of me and my paternal grandfather on the cover, and on the back side, how I looked in 1999 with a lot more hair. If you're interested in purchasing some, and still have a CD device to play them on, they sell for the bargain basement price of \$15, and I'll share half the proceeds of each sale with the church, deposited in the general budget.

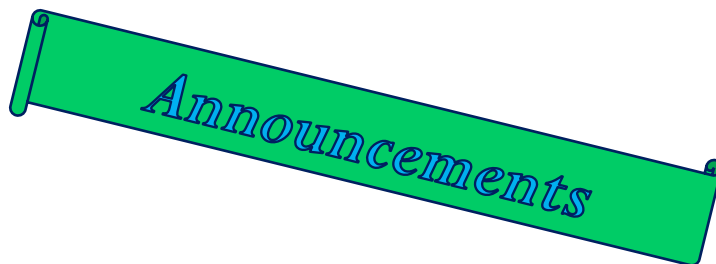

**Outreach Committee Meeting
Monday April 11, 2022**

Attendees: Mary Bloomstran, Jean Arnold, Mary Jane Eddy Scott, Hamu Chigwada, and Shirley Coen, and Kristen Allen.

Action Center: Last month, \$1000 from the Coralie Brown account was sent to the Action Center. This fulfills a portion of a 5 year pledge to the Action Center. The Action Center is one of the charities that Coralie supported.

Coralie Brown Funds: Outreach voted to donate \$1,500 to the Global Ministries/UMCOR Ukraine fund. This leaves approximately \$6,000 in the Coralie Brown Outreach account. Discussion will occur at the next Outreach meeting to determine where the additional funds will be spent keeping in mind that we support the Action Center school supply drive in July and the Christmas toy drive and adopted families in December. Jean will investigate organizations supporting the Marshall fire victims where we can make a donation.

Bobby's Blessing Box: Outreach continues to support Bobbi's Blessing Box by purchasing food and filling the box twice per week. The collection box in the coat room is working well.

Family Promise: The Outreach Committee provided a meal to families staying at the Shepherd of the Hills Presbyterian Church in March and will provide an additional meal in May. Outreach funds are used to purchase ingredients for the meals.

Community Garden: The bricks are being ordered. The boy scout eagle project to construct bat boxes and raptor perches will be conducted soon. The bee permit has been obtained and the work crew put in the foundation for the beehives. Compost will be ordered and there are leaves left from the leaf drive. Watering will start in May. Need to coordinate with trustees when the water is turned on to make sure the garden valve is turned off. All plots are spoken for and there are two scholarship plots. The garden is participating in the plant sales. Plants will be \$50 each this year and 150 have been ordered from the grower. Shirley will be investigating the opportunities for GMUMC to participate in Fresh Food Connect.

Habitat: Outreach is continuing to search for a liaison for the interfaith partners group. There are two spots available for church members to participate in the Habitat build on April 23rd. GMUMC had one person volunteer.

Blood Drive: Outreach is continuing to reach out to Vitalant to determine when we can resume blood drives. Hopefully, we will be able to have a blood drive in November.

Ronald McDonald House: The Ronald McDonald House is slowly allowing volunteers in to prepare meals for the families. Outreach is going to look into some dates for meal preparation with the goal of involving all church members who would like to participate.

Next Meeting: The next meeting will be held via zoom on May 9th. Outreach is planning on having a breakfast or brunch in the garden (June timeframe) and inviting anyone interested in community and church outreach. A tour of the garden will also be offered.

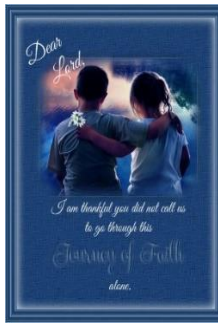

Spring is the time for our annual spring plant sale – along with the choirs. So, watch for more information to come in April. Visit the shade pergola and sit in the waking garden and watch for those early signs of spring. The pollinator garden is filled with perennials, and you can observe nature's progress. All are invited to come into the garden for a respite and to just *be* – *no matter the season*.

Garden plots. If you would like a garden plot for the 2022 growing season, please contact co-garden leader **Ali Young** (mustang.ali@hotmail.com) to be added to the wait list. Once the wait list reaches 10 people, we will close the list until the 2023 growing season. We expect to have 2-4 plots available in the 2022 season. Ali is coordinating garden plot assignments.

What we need:

- **Garden tools** – As you start working in your own garden – or you are downsizing – please think of the Garden and donate your used hand tools, rakes, shovels, wheelbarrows, etc. Any extra tools will be donated to DUG for other Community Gardens this spring.
- **Bricks** – The brick ongoing fund raiser. We anticipate installing the bricks in the spring/summer now that the fencing, compost bins and shade pergola are in (see below). **Denver Urban Gardens (DUG) Construction.** The bricks will be installed by a professional contractor, who met with Jean Arnold in August 2021. And we can continue to install bricks where we have blanks into the future.
