Mark's Musings

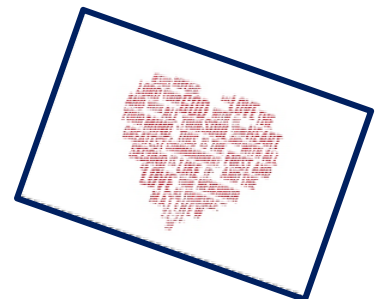

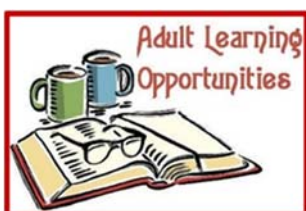

The Action Center is now taking all seasonal clothing donations and also donations of blankets and linens as well as non-perishable food. Visit their website for donation drive thru times.

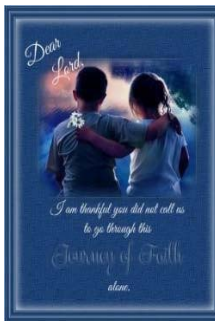

King Soopers Community Rewards



As many of you know King Soopers has ended its gift card program. In its place, they have initiated the Community Rewards Program. This is a just a reminder for those of you who need to link their SooperCard, so that the church will still be getting money for your shopping at King Soopers.

You will need to create a digital account by going www.KingSoopers.com/CommunityRewards.

You will then select **Create an Account**. Under sign-in information, enter your email and create a password (write down your password, you will need it in step 2). Select 'Use Card Number' and enter your SooperCard Number or Alternate ID, last name, and zip code. Under 'Select your Store,' enter your zip code and then select 'Find Stores.' Choose your store and then select 'Create Account.' Once you get the welcome email, then you can go back in clicking on the link in the email and finish creating your account. Then click on the Community Rewards link on the left hand side and either search by Green Mountain United Methodist Church or use this number to find us: RK117, which is our organization code. DID YOU KNOW?

Things about Green Mountain United Methodist Church you might find interesting and/or useful to know.

CHAPTER 1 - GMUMC INFORMATION (in no particular order of importance)

Watch for CHAPTER 2 coming next month

- **Green Mountain United Methodist Church** was officially organized January 13, 1963. So, we are now 59 years old! Charter members Lorene Branson (*wife of the founding student pastor*) and Dolores Bammerlin are still very active members of our congregation. Pick up a booklet on the 1st 50 years of our church history in the narthex information literature rack!
- We have three church members proficient in American Sign Language if needed. They are Ann Topliff, Katy Griebble, and Jean Arnold.
- The sanctuary stained glass window theme of the **"Living Water"** flowing as a stream, taking life to those in our community and world is continued in the rock river along the north steps. You can read about the sanctuary stained glass window and the stained glass window in the west building's original sanctuary in the pew inserts.
- Do you want to get an email or telephone number of a church member? Simply load "Instant Church Directory" on your tablet or phone (*from Google play, Kindle store, or Apple store*). It has a yellow church icon. The site will ask for your email which must be in our directory, then set your password. If you have a current picture of yourself or family, we would appreciate having it emailed to the church for the directory.
- The GMUMC columbarium was dedicated in September 2004. The cost of a single niche is \$700. A double niche cost is \$900. Contact Meg at the church office for assistance in making a niche reservation.
- Every Thursday eight "faithful" quilters meet in the Fellowship Hall, get out the sewing machines, fabric, and scissors, etc. and get to work. Peggy Morrison and Gerry Rickett are the leaders of this group which so far this year have put in 1,200 hours. In 2022 the quilters have donated 46 quilts and 98 dog/cat beds for the shelter. They will be making "mug rugs" for Meals on Wheels to give out to clients before Christmas. Please see separate WOH article for 2021 Quilters report below. Quilters continue to accept donations of cotton, flannel, and fleece fabric.
- Do you have old eyeglasses or hearing aids resting in a drawer? There is a labeled white plastic collection drawer at the west entrance. Lorene Branson takes them to a Lions Club member at her residence. This organization's service project was grateful to GMUMC for sending them two large bags of glasses last month.
- Those little bottles of shampoo, hand lotion, etc. that motels give you are so appreciated by the folks at homeless shelters. There is a collection drawer at the west entrance for these accumulated toiletries. Barb Stoddard took a large bagful of them to the Action Center recently.
- There are three exits from the sanctuary area: **1)** The door next to the bells leads out to the columbarium or downstairs to the Fellowship Hall. **2)** The main sanctuary rear doors lead to the north doors or downstairs via staircases in both directions. **3)** The door next to the sound booth leads downstairs and outside next to the playground or outside through the patio doors.
- Did you know that our Automated External Defibrillator (**AED**) is in the Gathering Place next to the copy room? Kim Myers has conducted a training session for many interested members. A fire alarm is located next to the north doors, and a telephone is located in the coat room (Dial "9" for outside line.).

20 Years of GMUMC Quilting

In January 2002 June Ryker put a notice in a Sunday bulleting about starting a group at church for anyone interested in learning how to make quilts. Many responded, and that was the beginning of the 20 years the group has been making quilts for charity.

In spite of the continuing pandemic during 2021, twelve quilters worked nearly 1,900 hours, made, and donated 60 quilts to the following charities:

Bessie's Hope	Warm Hearts, Warm Babies

The group donated 70 placemats to Meals on Wheels and 83 Christmas stockings for The Action Center's Holiday Shop. In addition, fabric and batting scraps were used for 30 dog beds donated to Foothills Animal Shelter.

In 2018 the group helped with the Youth Mission Project to make pillowcases for foster children. Quilts were also donated to victims of the Marshall Fire in Boulder County.

On **September 18, 2022**, Outreach and the Garden will host an **"open house"** after church. Come meet the gardeners, enjoy some garden treats, learn about outreach opportunities, and engage in fellowship.
