### Mark's Musings

Helen Steiner was born in Lorain, Ohio on May 19, 1900. She began work for a public utility and progressed to the position of advertising manager, which was rare for a woman at that time. She also became the Ohio State Chairman of the Women's Public Information Committee of the Electric Light Association and campaigned for women's rights and improved working conditions.

In 1929, she married Franklin Dryden Rice, a bank vice-president. Following the stock market crash in October, he lost his job and his investments and fell into a depression from which he never recovered. He committed suicide in 1932.

Helen became a successful businesswoman and lecturer but found her most satisfying outlet in writing verse for the greeting card company, Gibson Greetings. Her poems received wide exposure in the 1960s when several were read on the poetry segment of the Lawrence Welk television show. She has since sold nearly seven million books of poetry and has been acclaimed as America's beloved inspirational poet laureate. Her admirers include none other than former President Jimmy Carter, first lady Rosalynn, and Pope John Paul II.

She died on the evening of April 23, 1981, a month before her 81st birthday, and was buried in Elmwood Cemetery in the town where she was born.

Perhaps her most famous poem is entitled, *The Key to Living is Giving*, and I thought it might be something helpful to ponder in this upcoming month of our annual stewardship campaign:

***A very favorite story to tell is about two seas in Israel - -***

One is a sparkling sapphire jewel; it's waters are clean, clear, and cool.  
Along its shores the children play, and travelers seek it on their way,  
And nature gives so lavishly her choicest gems to the Galilee...  
But on to the south the Jordan flows into a sea where nothing grows.  
No splash of fish, no singing bird, no children's laughter is ever heard.  
The air hangs heavy all around and nature shuns this barren ground...  
Both seas receive the Jordan's flow, the water is just the same, we know.  
But one of the seas, like liquid sun can warm the hearts of everyone.  
While farther south another sea is dead, dark, and miserly - -  
It takes each drop the Jordan brings, and to each drop it fiercely clings.  
It hoards and holds the Jordan's waves, until like shackled, captured slaves,  
The fresh, clear Jordan turns to salt and dies with the Dead Sea's vault...  
But the Jordan flows on rapturously as it enters and leaves the Galilee,  
For every drop that the Jordan gives becomes a laughing wave that lives - -  
For the Galilee gives back each drop, its waters flow and never stop.  
And in this laughing, living sea that takes and give so generously,  
We find the key to life and living is not in keeping, but in giving.  
Yes, there are two Israeli seas. And we are fashioned after these!

The Action Center is now taking all seasonal clothing donations and also donations of blankets and linens as well as non-perishable food. Visit their website for donation drive thru times.

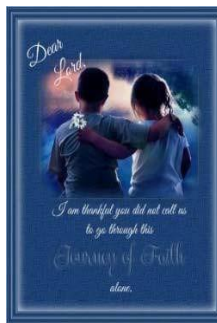

You will need to create a digital account by going to [www.KingSoopers.com/CommunityRewards](http://www.KingSoopers.com/CommunityRewards).

You will then select **Create an Account**. Under sign-in information, enter your email and create a password (write down your password, you will need it in step 2). ## DID YOU KNOW?

Things about **Green Mountain United Methodist Church** you might find interesting and/or useful to know.

**CHAPTER 2 – GMUMC INFORMATION in no particular order of importance.**

*What will be in CHAPTER 3 next month? Stay tuned.*

- All of the outside lights and inside lighting fixtures (including the sanctuary) have been retrofitted to LED. Many of the sanctuary stage spotlights and cove lights along the beams had burned out. All the pews had to be moved to get our lift in place to reach those high areas, but fortunately this occurred when we were shut down due to covid. Many building areas have motion sensors for auto on/off. The expense of this project was paid for by memorial and endowment funds. No budget funds were used! Our electric bill has been substantially lowered, and it is wonderful to have lights that do not flicker and dim. Thanks to Mike Lyons for his electrical wisdom and advice too!
- "May Peace Prevail on Earth" The Peace Pole at GMUMC is located west of the bottom of the north steps. It was put there in the 80's (?). Congregation members decided on which 3 languages to put on the plates by dropping money in cans labeled with language choices. The three largest amounts of money determined the winners. Upon asking Google to translate the plates recently, it was determined that the three remaining plates are in Chinese, Spanish, and English. During Grubby Sunday, Spring 2019, Trustees took the language plates off our Peace Pole to clean while repainting the pole. They noticed that one of the plastic plates was broken and needed replacement. A new plate in Shona, the language of Zimbabwe, the country where Calvin Mukarakate and Hamu Chigwada immigrated from was ordered. At a worship service in June 2019, they were presented with the new plate - "Runyararo ngaruveko pasi rose".
- Are you interested in scrapbooking? There is a group that usually meets the 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday of each month at church to work on their scrapbooks. They spread out their work on generous table space and share their artistic ideas. Contact Renee Parker at 303-534-6430 to find out their next meeting date and time.
- Several groups regularly rent our facilities for meetings and music practice. On Monday evenings the Fellowship Hall is filled with musicians from the Rocky Mountain Ukulele Orchestra and on Tuesday evenings the Lakewood Symphony Orchestra practice there. There are two AA groups and one HA group. AA Groups meet on Monday and Wednesday and HA meets on Wednesday. On Wednesday there is an HOA group meeting. Several nearby homeowner's associations also meet at GMUMC.
- GMUMC began live streaming Sunday worship services in February. There are two cameras, one over the main sanctuary doors and another in the rear near the smaller exit door past the sound booth. An operator remotely controls these cameras (in an off-site, unknown location!) by Live Control, the company we contract with. Meg sends them the Sunday bulletin each Wednesday with which the operator uses to position the cameras during the service. Vince and Kristen Allen, Ron and Jane Bernard, and Calvin Mukarakate and Hamu Chigwada take turns operating the sound system console and projector computer. The service can also be viewed later on YouTube. We also have the opportunity to stream "static" events for free when the cameras are only focused on the stage for events such as a funeral service or concert.
- The sound booth was originally built on the floor level; however, whenever the congregation stood up to sing, etc., whatever was occurring on the stage became impossible to see. In 2013 endowment funds enabled GMUMC to rebuild the sound booth at a height above the congregation. New projectors were installed in 2015, and a new sound system was installed in 2018.
- Our wood signs on Cedar Avenue are made by Chuck Thorman. Whenever we get a new pastor or changes such as worship times, he routers a new board and installs it.
- And... Chuck Thorman is a one-man band as he plays his trumpet along with the organ on hymns each Sunday. On Easter we have a two-man band as Mike Lyons joins him on trumpet.
- On June 3, 2022, Governor Polis came to our Tiny Hearts Academy playground to formally sign the new free pre-school bill. Our site was on the news!

- United Methodist Women have changed their name to “**Women of Faith**.” Brenda Bronson, Hamu Chigwada, Penny Mukarakate, Penelope – Hamu’s mother, and baby Maxwell traveled to Orlando, Florida, in May. Over 2,000 women from around the world attended the Assembly with focus topics on Social Justice for Women, Children, and Youth. Hamu is the Secretary of the Western Jurisdiction Board. **Green Mountain Women of Faith** meet the **1<sup>st</sup> Thursday each month** at 8:30 am at the IHOP at Lakewood Commons. - Beginning in 1994 a Chili Cookoff was held each year to benefit the Youth Scholarship Fund. This popular event was suspended during Covid. The Skillern Scholarship was established from their memorials, and the Barbara Thorman Scholarship was established in 2012 from her memorials. Graduating GMUMC seniors submit their applications for committee evaluation and awards.

We had one graduating high school senior Youth Scholarship Recipient in 2022. This brings us to a total 97 scholarship recipients since the beginning of the program in 1994. As of today, GMUMC will have awarded scholarships to graduating seniors in the amount of \$126,800 since the inception of the Youth Scholarship program 28 years ago. We can be proud of the accomplishments and support given to our seniors and, more especially, in the accomplishments of our youth. The quality of our youth is something to be very proud of at GMUMC.

Harvest time is continuing in the garden as the snap peas finish their run – the zucchini plants are producing **lots** of zucchini. The pumpkins are growing bigger, and a few are starting to turn from green to orange.

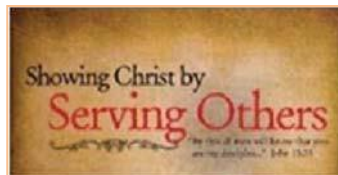
