Mark's Musings

Satori is a Japanese term for comprehension or understanding, also synonymous with awakening and enlightenment. The 20th century Zen Buddhist monk and teacher Suzuki was once asked, "What is it like to have satori?" And he answered, "Well, it's just like ordinary everyday experience, except about two inches off the ground."

So, there's that.

Then, there's this, another bit of Buddhist wisdom, this from the wit of American author and teacher, Jack Kornfield: "After the ecstasy, the laundry."

The great eastern spiritual traditions teach that all things are known only in relation to other things. Rather than light and dark, i.e., being diametrically opposed to one another, they may instead be understood as two sides of the same coin. Or, in a more favorable analogy, like a Reese's chocolate covered peanut butter cup, two tastes that go great together, and in a necessary cooperative balance. Similarly, I think that's what the two above mentioned teachers have in mind, too: a balanced relationship between living with one's head in the clouds but also with one's feet grounded on the earth. Earthbound enough to hear and be attentive to the needs of the world; but, at the same time, not so bound up in excessive and exclusive identification with them that we can't easily lift off at a moment's notice when the wind of the Spirit happens to blow by.

Some Christians attempt to bear extra heavy weights of discipline as their witness during the yearly season of Lent. And the irritability as a result of one's coffee or chocolate fast doesn't lighten the mood any either. But what if Lent was really all about the very opposite, becoming unexpectedly and joyfully weightless even amidst the downward gravitational pull and overall stressful atmosphere at work or the relentless boredom of everyday, mundane tasks? (Does not resurrection imply a joyful weightlessness?) A wonderful balance of *in* reach and *out*, both benefiting one another in an ever circling, fluid, adaptive dance of sorts.

A final illustration to round out the bunch, this one from our own Christian tradition, concerning one Father William Ralph Inge, former dean of St Paul's Cathedral in London & three time nominee for the Nobel Prize in Literature. Father Inge happened to have a pronounced tic that was difficult to ignore in public. Some thought it unfortunate, but others who knew him well said it was because he was always about to levitate, and he just had to keep himself pressed down.

Think of all the shared wisdom and helping hands extended to us over our lives that we might have otherwise missed had our helpers levitated too high to be of any assistance. Be careful not to let your Lenten disciplines for the next month rise you up to heights too inaccessible to the rest of us. Who knows when your help may be required?

Pastor's Lenten Book Study


Grace is at the very heart of the Christian Faith, but often completely misunderstood, every bit as confounding as inspiring, saving yet not without first convicting. And while forgiven sinners joyfully receive its gift and pronounce it to be 'amazing,' others find the divine justice exercised in grace not so much awesomely amazing as awfully atrocious. Episcopal priest and author Father Robert Capon chooses to simply echo the New Testament in its own proclamation of grace as a 'mystery.' Thus, the title of his engaging book, <u>"The Mystery of Christ (... & why we don't get it.)</u>"

Reminding his readers, sometimes in startling ways, that salvation is a gift rather than a transaction, Father Capon uses a variety of dialogues with a variety of folks representing a variety of theological understandings and practices to explore not only grace, but related Lenten themes of guilt, forgiveness, love, anger, romance, grief, the Incarnation, reincarnation, and resurrection, to name a few. "<u>The Mystery of Christ</u>, one theologian pronounces, "is 'good news' without reserve. Closet Puritans and Pharisees, beware: Father Capon refuses to let guilt sneak in and make a system of redemption out of Christianity."

It's not too late to join us for our Lenten Book Study, Sun mornings at 9:00 a.m., or Tuesday mornings at 10, beginning February 26 & 28, respectively. (And please have the first two chapters read before our first gathering.) Copies will be available @ church for around \$20, or you may purchase a copy, new or used, from online sites like Cokesbury, Amazon, or Barnes/Noble.

GMUMC Online Directory

There are two ways to access the church online directory with pictures of members, their phone numbers, and emails. The church office will need to have put your information into the directory in order for you to open and use directory.



Here are the two methods.

- 1. Go to the church website, <u>gmumc.com</u>, and click on "directory" which is on the bottom bar of the home page. You may either download or open the directory. You will need the church password, so call the church office at 303-989-3727 to obtain the directory password.
- 2. Download the app on your smart phone or tablet: Instant Church Directory by Communication Resources (a yellow church icon). The app will ask for your email address (which must be in the directory), and then you can set a password. You can get the app on Google play, the Kindle store, or the Apple store.

LifeSpark Cancer Resources

LifeSpark Cancer Resources is a Colorado non-profit organization that uses Reiki and Healing Touch wellness therapies to bring peace and healing to individuals with cancer. Sessions are offered at partner locations including hospitals, spas, and churches, as well as remote locations. For many years Green Mtn. UMC has hosted LifeSpark massage sessions in a room opposite the church nursery in the lower west building.

How LifeSpark Sessions Work:

- *LifeSpark* wellness therapies promote peace and healing on all levels.
- Adults 18 and over with cancer are eligible: any type or stage of cancer.
- Receive 8 weeks of healing sessions, scheduled at a time convenient for you.
- You'll be matched with an experienced healing touch or Reiki provider.
- Caregivers are eligible (family members who take care of a cancer patient)
- *LifeSpark* is a free program.
- *LifeSpark* sessions last about an hour.
- LifeSpark sessions do not replace medical care, but rather support you during and after cancer treatment.






