**Mark's Musings**

I don't find books as much as they find me. And even then, I don't read them until we both agree that I'm ready, that I'm in a place to be able to enjoy and benefit from their contents. A few months ago, I began Charles Bukowski's *The Last Night of the Earth Poems*, a collection written a couple of years before his death in 1994 at the age of 73.\* I've read some of Bukowski's earlier work with mixed reviews, but I'm resonating much more with these particular poems from his final years as they bear witness to his experience of life as an older man, a territory becoming more familiar to me at my 63 years of age. And, as might be expected, a lot of Bukowski's ruminations concern death. But, with an interesting take.

For example, from the poem 'only one Cervantes':

*'... and if I know there are other  
old men  
in hospitals and nursing  
homes  
sitting upright in their  
beds  
grunting over bedpans.  
death is nothing, brother,  
it's life that's  
hard.'*

Or this, from a poem simply entitled, *ill*:

*'... the closer you get to it (death),  
the less forbidding it  
becomes.'*

While most certainly not a Christian (in fact, nowhere near!), Bukowski still expresses two reactions to death that one would expect from a believer of the good news of Jesus: acceptance and, even, gratitude. That's right, you read it correctly: gratitude. Consider: do you really want to live *forever*? I mean, really think about it. The nonagenarians among us are already well-acquainted with a variety of disabling health issues. How do you imagine that same aging body would function after 100 or 200, 500, 1000 years old! At that point, death is not an enemy. It's a friend. A release.

One of the many reasons why the Church refers to the remembrance of Jesus' own death as *Good Friday* was because Jesus understood it as a victory of God over the powers of darkness that imagined death could possibly silence the abundant Life to which Jesus gave witness. Friday's death is good news and Easter's resurrection even better because God showed us in Jesus that there is nothing to fear. The ultimate victory has already been won, and we're on the winning team. We (and all) may look forward to our own deaths when our material selves have run their course on this terrestrial ball, because our immaterial selves (spirit) have already (and for all time) been redeemed by Jesus' death and resurrection.

May the seeds of the Lenten faith buried in February blossom into Easter fruit this spring month of April.

## Green Mountain United Women in Faith (UWFAITH) Happenings (formerly known as United Methodist Women)

**Please attend and participate in our UWFAITH Sunday at GMUMC on April 23 at 10:30am**

We'd love your help with our service that morning on refugees, where we will be kicking off our **UWFAith & Outreach Committee project to co-sponsor an immigrant family through the International Rescue Committee of Colorado (along with Arvada UMC)!**

We will have 2 inspiring speakers from IRC give the message at our service April 23. We will take a special free-will offering during the service to help sponsor our family - our first fundraising effort.

Co-sponsorship is a partnership between an established group and the IRC to provide a network of support for a newly arrived refugee family. The established group provides a financial commitment and a time commitment to the family as they learn to navigate cultural, linguistic, social challenges.

To sponsor a family through IRC, our group needs to commit to (1) raising \$3,000 in cash, in-kind contributions, or a combination of both, and (2) offering 6-8 volunteers who commit to working with the family to meet basic needs for a 2-4 hours a week for 6 months.

Last year, the International Rescue Committee (IRC) provided services to roughly 2,000 refugees, asylees, survivors of torture, and other vulnerable populations. While the work is great, the need is greater. Co-sponsorship provides an opportunity for community groups to get involved and help refugees along their resettlement journey.

Our church has a rich history of helping refugee families. We are stepping out in faith you will want to come to the service and help support this project.

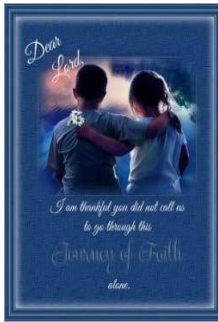

## GMUMC Online Directory

There are two ways to access the church online directory with pictures of members, their phone numbers, and emails. The church office will need to have put your information into the directory in order for you to open and use directory.

Here are the two methods.

1. Go to the church website, [gmumc.com](http://gmumc.com), and click on “directory” which is on the bottom bar of the home page. You may either download or open the directory. You will need the church password, so call the church office at 303-989-3727 to obtain the directory password.
2. Download the app on your smart phone or tablet: Instant Church Directory by Communication Resources (a yellow church icon). The app will ask for your email address (which must be in the directory), and then you can set a password. You can get the app on Google play, the Kindle store, or the Apple store.

**LifeSpark Cancer Resources** is a Colorado non-profit organization that uses Reiki and Healing Touch wellness therapies to bring peace and healing to individuals with cancer. Sessions are offered at partner locations including hospitals, spas, and churches, as well as remote locations. **For many years Green Mtn. UMC has hosted LifeSpark massage sessions in a room opposite the church nursery in the lower west building.**

***How LifeSpark Sessions Work:***

- **LifeSpark** wellness therapies promote peace and healing on all levels.
- Adults 18 and over with cancer are eligible: any type or stage of cancer.
- Receive 8 weeks of healing sessions, scheduled at a time convenient for you.
- You'll be matched with an experienced healing touch or Reiki provider.
- Caregivers are eligible (*family members who take care of a cancer patient*)
- **LifeSpark** is a free program.
- **LifeSpark** sessions last about an hour.
- **LifeSpark** sessions do not replace medical care, but rather support you during and after cancer treatment.

## News from the Cedar Hill Community Garden

*The garden is part of Denver Urban Gardens (DUG) community gardens.*

*Note: the garden is always unlocked so feel free to visit at any time.*

**The vision:** Feeding our community. *"I hope that time spent in the garden can grow not only sustainable food but a community from diverse people and foster a sense of place that brings peace."* Lori Osborn.

The Garden is *starting to wake up* for 2023. The plots are empty, but you will soon see the gardeners digging in the leaves donated by many of you in the fall, used as sheet composting over the winter months. The leaves will also be used to cover the plots once planted and extras used to make compost as "browns" during the growing season – nothing goes to waste.

**Garden Plots.** We are starting our fourth growing season in 2023, and we have a few plots available. If you would like a garden plot for the 2023 growing season, please contact co-garden leader **Ali Young** ([mustang.ali@hotmail.com](mailto:mustang.ali@hotmail.com)) to be added to the list. We anticipate having 2-3 plots opening up in April/May.

**Bees.** Our bees did not survive the -20° weather. We have an Eagle Scout from Boy Scout Troop 989 working with Ali to improve the weather protection for the hives. Ali and her bee keepers will reestablish the hives this Spring. If you would like to learn about bee keeping or help with the hives, contact Ali ([mustang.ali@hotmail.com](mailto:mustang.ali@hotmail.com)) for more information. You do not have to have a plot in the garden to work with Ali and her team of beekeepers.

### **What we need:**

- **Garden tools** – As you begin work in your gardens, downsize or clean out your garages and sheds – please think of the Garden and donate your used hand tools, rakes, shovels, wheelbarrows, etc. Any extra tools will be donated to DUG for other Community Gardens.
- **Bricks** – The brick fund raiser is still on going. **Jean Arnold** will be placing the brick order at the beginning of April with a 6-8 week delivery for bricks. I have contacted some of you to finalize the "words" for your bricks. ## King Soopers Community Rewards



As many of you know King Soopers has ended its gift card program. In its place, they have initiated the Community Rewards Program. This is a just a reminder for those of you who need to link their SooperCard, so that the church will still be getting money for your shopping at King Soopers

You will need to create a digital account by going to [www.KingSoopers.com/CommunityRewards](http://www.KingSoopers.com/CommunityRewards).

You will then select **Create an Account**. Under sign-in information, enter your email and create a password (write down your password, you will need it in step 2). Select 'Use Card Number' and enter your SooperCard Number or Alternate ID, last name, and zip code. Under 'Select your Store,' enter your zip code and then select 'Find Stores.'
