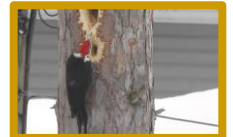

I still believe that the Cameron United Methodist Church is haunted. A life of 'treats' is not one absent of 'tricks,' but one on who believes that there might just be treats to be found even amongst the tricks... and then goes out and collects 'em with the focused hope of a costumed toddler on Halloween night, led by visions of candy. Is life only a series of events happening to you, or might it be something sweeter, a series of events happening for you? Including even the 'tricks.'

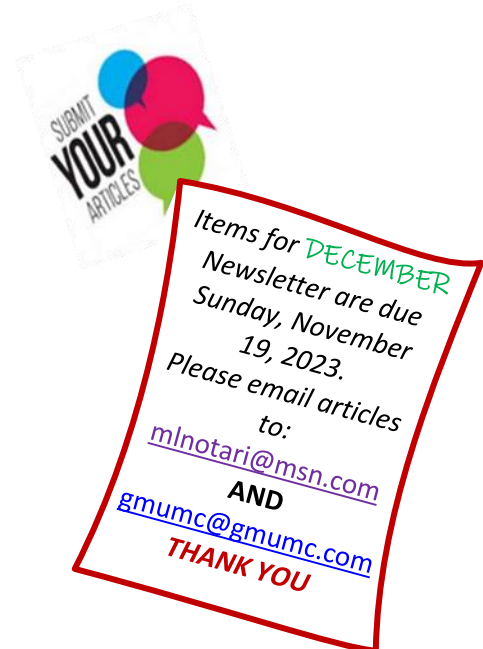

King Soopers Community Rewards



As many of you know King Soopers has ended its gift card program. In its place, they have initiated the Community Rewards Program. This is a just a reminder for those of you who need to link their SooperCard, so that the church will still be getting money for your shopping at King Soopers

You will need to create a digital account by going to www.KingSoopers.com/CommunityRewards.

You will then select **Create an Account**. Under sign-in information, enter your email and create a password (write down your password, you will need it in step 2). Select 'Use Card Number' and enter your SooperCard Number or Alternate ID, last name, and zip code. Under 'Select your Store,' enter your zip code and then select 'Find Stores.' Choose your store and then select 'Create Account.' Once you get the welcome email, then you can go back in clicking on the link in the email and finish creating your account.

GMUMC Online Directory

There are two ways to access the church online directory with pictures of members, their phone numbers, and emails. The church office will need to have put your information into the directory in order for you to open and use directory.

Here are the two methods.

1. Go to the church website, gmumc.com, and click on "directory" which is on the bottom bar of the home page. You may either download or open the directory. You will need the church password, so call the church office at 303-989-3727 to obtain the directory password.
2. Download the app on your smart phone or tablet: Instant Church Directory by Communication Resources (a yellow church icon). The app will ask for your email address (which must be in the directory), and then you can set a password. You can get the app on Google play, the Kindle store, or the Apple store

LifeSpark Cancer Resources

LifeSpark Cancer Resources is a Colorado non-profit organization that uses Reiki and Healing Touch wellness therapies to bring peace and healing to individuals with cancer. Sessions are offered at partner locations including hospitals, spas, and churches, as well as remote locations. **For many years Green Mtn. UMC has hosted LifeSpark massage sessions in a room opposite the church nursery in the lower west building.**

How LifeSpark Sessions Work:

- **LifeSpark** wellness therapies promote peace and healing on all levels.
- Adults 18 and over with cancer are eligible: any type or stage of cancer.
- Receive 8 weeks of healing sessions, scheduled at a time convenient for you.
- You'll be matched with an experienced healing touch or Reiki provider.
- Caregivers are eligible (*family members who take care of a cancer patient*)
- **LifeSpark** is a free program.
- **LifeSpark** sessions last about an hour.
- **LifeSpark** sessions do not replace medical care, but rather support you during and after cancer treatment.

News from the Cedar Hill Community Garden

The garden is part of Denver Urban Gardens (DUG) community gardens.

Note: the garden is always unlocked so feel free to visit at any time.

The vision: Feeding our community. *"I hope that time spent in the garden can grow not only sustainable food but a community from diverse people and foster a sense of place that brings peace."* Lori Osborn

The Garden is *going to bed* for 2023. **We need your leaves for sheet composting.** Please deliver leaves to the north and south shed areas. We still have a few bags from last season that we're using up. It takes about 3-4 bags of leaves for each garden plot for sheet composting. And we will be adding leaves through the winter months. Any remaining leaves will be used by Bob and his team of composters to make compost.

As the gardeners clean out the gardens from the long growing season, we are celebrating our fourth successful growing season with every plot under cultivation. We have grown pumpkins, strawberries (with Nate and Tiny Hearts), Swiss chard, beans, peas, peppers, onions, basil, marigolds, columbines, cosmos, nasturtium, kale, lettuce, beats, eggplant, arugula, zucchini, sunflowers, zinnias, columbines, the list goes on.

We fed our neighbors (and ourselves) with vegetables – placing lots of our extra vegies (tomatoes, zucchini, beans, peppers, etc.) in **Bobbie's Blessing Box** during the growing season where they moved into the community within a few hours. Our community has found the Garden! All are invited to come into the garden for a respite and to just *be present*.

Eagle Project #3 Installing the memorial and paver bricks. Jackson Burford with Boy Scout Troop 989, with the supervision of our contractor Javier, will be installing the bricks under the shade pergola in the coming weeks – weather and schedules permitting. The troop will also be adding crusher fines to the paths. The garden only has about 1/3 to 1/2 of the fines needed on the paths due to supply issues when the garden was built in 2020.

What we need:

- **Someone to repair our two wheel barrows or new or gently used wheel barrows.** Our current wheel barrows aren't doing great and they get a lot of use. **If someone has the skills, please see or call Jean Arnold. 303.257.2659**
- **Garden tools** – As you put your own garden to bed – or you are downsizing – please think of the Garden and donate your used hand tools, rakes, shovels, wheelbarrows, etc. Any extra tools will be donated to DUG for other Community Gardens.
- **Donations for scholarship plots.** Two of the plots in the garden are scholarship plots. Thank you for your 2022 donations making these plots possible for gardeners in 2023. The cost to support a scholarship plot is \$50 / plot.

Garden plots. If you would like a garden plot for the 2024 growing season, please contact co-garden leader **Ali Young** (mustang.ali@hotmail.com) to be added to the list. We anticipate having 2 plots open up this spring. Once the wait list reaches 10 people, we will close the list until the 2025 growing season.

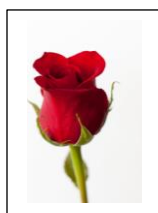

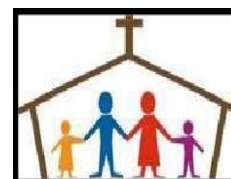
