Window on the Hill

Mark's Musings

We always put the cart before the horse at this time of year; with all that October Halloween candy serving as desert before November's grand Thanksgiving feast of turkey and all the trimmings. So, now that we are properly turning our attention to the entrée part of this autumn season, allow me to offer this little complimentary side dish of a tale from the Zen Buddhist tradition, set around a dinner table:

A very wealthy, powerful, and well-connected individual invites the renowned Zen master Ikkyu to a fancy dinner party. Ikkyu arrives dressed in his humble robes, as was his custom, but is recognized neither by the host nor his servants or any of the other guests, and based upon his appearance is turned away at the door. So, Ikkyu goes back to his temple, puts on his finest ceremonial robes, and returns. This time, the host and staff immediately recognize him due to his impressive attire and welcome him with great respect and deference, seating him at the place of honor and offering him a plate heaped with the best of the food. Instead of feasting, though, Ikkyu begins scooping up the meal and stuffing it into the sleeves and down the collar of his ceremonial robe. When questioned by the host about this unusual behavior, Ikkyu explains that since he was only properly welcomed when wearing his fine robe, it must be that the robe, not him, who was the true guest of honor and therefore entitled to the meal.





Church Security Updates

"A safe and secure church means that all of the People, Places, Property, Programs, and Processes of the place of worship are functioning in a way that is as free from the potential for harm as possible, twenty-four hours a day, every day, in every service and activity. At the same time, leaders, volunteers and congregants are ready to respond to a threat or emergency of any kind, to get assistance and to help themselves and others."

To this end, the Trustees of Green Mountain United Methodist Church have attended local law enforcement meetings on church security, consulted church security videos and publications, and analyzed GMUMC's current security situation with Lakewood Police. The procedures listed below need to be revisited annually to insure we continue to be alert to any improvements or additions that can be made to our security plans.

Security Currently In Place at GMUMC

- ⇒ **Door lock system with key cards.** Sundays: West and North doors are open from 9 am to 11 am. Daycare door and the doors at the ends of the west building hallway are always locked. Weekdays and Saturday: All doors are locked unless a meeting is scheduled. The door is unlocked 15 min before a meeting and is relocked 15 min after the meeting is scheduled to begin. Monday thru Thursday visitors can gain entry by ringing the north door doorbell and being let in by staff.
- ⇒ Broomsticks are in the tracks of sliding patio doors in the Fireside Room.

- ⇒ **Twelve security cameras** are located throughout the building and parking lot. These cameras record activity continuously and can be remotely accessed.
- ⇒ Exterior security. Lighting around entire exterior has LED floodlights; lights are on photo-timers. There are no tall, thick bushes in front of doors or windows. The exit door in the hall from the sanctuary to the columbarium (next to the bell tables) has an alarm that sounds when it is opened. There is an alarm on the door at the top of the ramp to the west building. Additionally, Tiny Hearts Academy has video cameras in all of their rooms, over the daycare exterior door, and the playground. Two-way radios are used with their workers in all their rooms. The daycare exterior door is always locked. Parents are buzzed in remotely after viewing through a camera.

Additional Security Procedures Recommended by Trustees

- ⇒ Members should report to the church staff or Lakewood Police any security situations such as (1) persons or family members having issues against church and/or staff and (2) persons having issues with church members that could seek revenge against them at the church. Reports can be anonymous. Intervention procedures will be initiated by either church staff or police, as necessary.
- ⇒ An **automated external defillabrator (AED)** is installed in a cabinet in the Gathering Place on the upper wall next to the copy room.
- ⇒ **Ushers on Sunday mornings** should monitor the north door and steps and the narthex area for armed intruder and/or risk control. The fire alarm next to the north door should be used to alert the congregation to exit the building.
- ⇒ Write an article for the Window on the Hill and/or bulletin regarding basic security procedures. Reinforce the mantra "Run, Hide, Fight".
- ⇒ Remind groups that use the church for meetings that it is not acceptable to put rocks or other objects on the door sill to prevent it from locking.
- ⇒ Arrange for Lakewood Police or Jefferson County Sheriff deputies to provide security for special events.


Action Center
