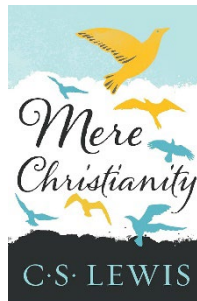

MARK'S MUSINGS

Mere Christianity is one of the finest Christian apologetical works in recorded history. Right up there with St. Augustine's *Confessions*, which is pretty heady company if you ask me. Rest assured British author C. S. (Clive Staples) Lewis lives up to the claim. Adapted from a series of BBC radio talks made between 1941 and 1944, *Mere Christianity* presents Lewis' defense of Christian theology and exploration of Christian ethics delivered in his always insightful, often humorous style of writing. After all, we are talking about the same fellow who wrote books like *The Chronicles of Narnia* and *The Screwtape Letters*. (Incidentally, Monty Python's John Cleese does a terrific job narrating the latter on CD. Chances are your public library has a copy.)

If I were to pick one book that best captures the overall gist of the Christian Faith- a book that would explain proper Christian belief and application to someone with no prior experience or knowledge of Jesus in the gospels- I would unhesitatingly choose *Mere Christianity*. Indeed, when asked which C.S. Lewis book has most influenced them spiritually, the most common answer people gave was *Mere Christianity*.



Translated to about 35 languages, used by Russia's Eastern Orthodox Christians to rebuild after the fall of the Soviet Union, and cited by a number of public figures (i.e., Chuck Colson) as the influence to their conversion to Christianity, it makes a perfect fit for this year's Lenten Book Study/Discussion with the Pastor. We will gather every Tuesday morning at 10:00 a.m. in the Fireside Room, beginning March 11, with the final session wrapping up on April 15th, the Tuesday of Holy Week. Six sessions, about 35-40 pages weekly, followed by lively, inquisitive group discussion. Books are available for a mere \$12.00, the very number of Jesus' apostles! Join us, and bring a friend, too.

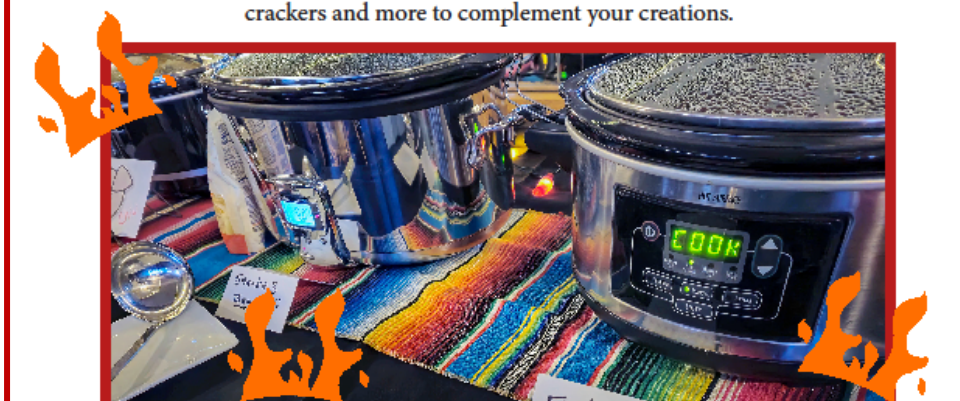

Thanks to Mike & Christie Lyons and Greg & Peter Montano (along with many people behind the scenes), we have this beautiful box that helps our neighbors.

When the box was first installed, there was about a two-week turnover rate. The turn-over rate is less than a day now. The word is out that it is here to help, AND the need is great. Trustees Report For 2024

The Trustees were busy in 2024 accomplishing a variety of improvements to the church facility. Not all were paid for by the Trustees budget as noted, and some were joint projects with SPR or Tiny Hearts Daycare. All helped keep our building and equipment up-to-date and in good condition. If you have questions, please ask one of the Trustees!

- Security Surveillance System installed – Cameras throughout the building can be viewed remotely. Images are saved. Paid for by Endowment Fund.
- Handrails installed in altar area.
- Solar panels installed – 100% consumption offset of GMUMC electricity saving approx. \$8,850 per year. Paid for by Endowment Fund
- Refurbished Swamp Cooler – The original was installed in 1979.
- New Kitchen Freezer – Paid for by Kitchen & Memorial Funds
- New Carpet for Youth Room
- New Benches in the Columbarium – Paid for by Columbarium Fund
- New handrail for Columbarium Steps – Paid for by donation
- Office Phone System Rewiring
- New Comcast Office Telephone System installed
- New Router/Firewall for Church Internet
- Revamped software/hardware for church offices. Paid for by Office Budget
- Key Card System replaced – paid for by Memorials
- Quilters Group moved to Rm 403 (Old Hilltoppers room)
- Church Nursery moved to Rm 404. Hilltoppers moved to Rm 204
- New flooring in Rm. 202 (Old Church Nursery) and Rm. 306 (former Asst. Pastor's office). Paid for by Tiny Hearts Daycare. These rooms will be rented by Tiny Hearts.
- H P Copier purchased to replace obsolete Risograph machine and rented copier. Office budget purchase – SPR.
- Room 201 Book reorganization. Books from Steve Walden's classes are being moved into Rm 201. Room 201 is also Bobbi's Box "hidden" food location.
- New Wooden Fence installed around playground. \$20,000 project paid for by Tiny Hearts.
- Sinks installed in 4 daycare rooms. \$30,000 project paid for by Tiny Hearts.
- Retaining Walls in Playground replaced. Original timbers were rotting.
- Boiler Pressure Relief Valves replaced, other plumbing repairs – done by custodian.
- GMUMC "Little Library" bookshelf now in narthex area.
- Coming in January – Commercial tree trimming. Partially paid for by donation.

Our GMUMC Chapel

Many of us rarely get to the upper south end of the West Building where our Youth and Children's classrooms are located to visit our chapel. The south end of the West Building was built in 1965, and the first service was held there on Christmas. The building was consecrated by Bishop R. Marvin Stuart on April 17, 1966. This first unit of our church building cost approximately \$90,000. This upper level of our first building served as our sanctuary until the East Building was erected in 1979.

A beautiful stained glass window was behind the altar and remains there today. The top circle symbolizes God and Eternity – without beginning or ending. The cross denotes Christ over all. The second circle symbolizes creation. It is not closed denoting this is an ongoing process. The dove in this circle is a symbol of Peace. The sunburst is a symbol of Hope. The triangle represents the Trinity – Father, Son, Holy Ghost. The Phoenix bird, rising from the ashes, is a symbol of new life and resurrection. The mountain peaks remind us of the Sermon on the Mount and of our church on Green Mountain.

Recently there was a wedding held in the chapel. There has also been an organ donated for the area. Consider using the chapel for small ceremonies or meditation or come to study the stained glass window and its symbolism.



GMUMC Online Directory

Here are instructions on how to access the church online directory with pictures of members, their phone numbers, and emails. The church office will need to have put your information into the directory in order for you to open and use directory.

Go to the **App Store**. Search for **"Instant Church Directory."** It is a **yellow icon** with a white church. **Install.**

Create Login by giving your email in the directory and creating a password. If your email is not in the directory, you will need to send the church office a message to add it to the directory.

Instant Church Directory will then send you an email asking you to confirm you are in directory by again asking for your email and password in that email.

The **Directory** will then pop up on your screen and you can begin searching for telephone numbers, etc.

When you close the **directory**, you will find the **Instant Church Directory icon** on your screen. To access the directory, just put in your email and password.

LifeSpark Cancer Resources

LifeSpark Cancer Resources is a Colorado non-profit organization that uses Reiki and Healing Touch wellness therapies to bring peace and healing to individuals with cancer. Sessions are offered at partner locations including hospitals, spas, and churches, as well as remote locations. **For many years Green Mtn. UMC has hosted LifeSpark massage sessions in a room opposite the church nursery in the lower west building.**

How LifeSpark Sessions Work:

- **LifeSpark** wellness therapies promote peace and healing on all levels.
- Adults 18 and over with cancer are eligible: any type or stage of cancer.
- Receive 8 weeks of healing sessions, scheduled at a time convenient for you.
- You'll be matched with an experienced healing touch or Reiki provider.
- Caregivers are eligible (*family members who take care of a cancer patient*)
- **LifeSpark** is a free program.
- **LifeSpark** sessions last about an hour.
- **LifeSpark** sessions do not replace medical care but rather support you during and after cancer treatment.
