Window on the Hill

Mark's Musings

One evening the 30th U.S. President, Calvin Coolidge, was sitting at dinner when a guest- well aware of the President's reputation for taciturnity- attempted to lure him into conversation. "I have made a bet, Mr. Coolidge," she began, "that I can get more than two words out of you tonight." He replied, "You lose."

I might have heard this next quote during an episode of the terrific modern western series, Justified (streaming on Hulu), but I can't remember for sure, so my apologies if you recognize it from elsewhere. The secret to Indian country, life on the rez, as imparted from a long time resident to a newcomer: "When you're losing your mind, only lose the parts that need losing."

Most historic, religious traditions all agree that spiritual progression is for losers! More about liberation than acquisition, release rather than retention; not so much adding onto as letting go of. Whenever I've gotten love 'right' its because of what I intentionally lost- my need to be right, for one thing. I once knew a fella who had memorized the entire 'Sermon on the Mount' in the gospel, several chapters worth. Quite an impressive addition to one's Christian discipleship. But what or whom would it benefit in the absence of the simple practice of love? Paul writes profoundly in his letter to the Christians in the ancient region of Macedonia (Paul's first visit into what we know today as Europe):

Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but EMPTIED himself... he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death- even death on a cross. Therefore God also highly exalted him...

What parts of you still need losing during this Lenten season in order to find your true self, created in the image of God, animated by the Holy Spirit, complete with an Easter resurrection?




UWFaith Book Club

Linda Sarsour, co-organizer of the Women's March, shares an "unforgettable memoir" (Booklist) about how growing up Palestinian Muslim American, feminist, and empowered moved her to become a globally recognized activist on behalf of marginalized communities across the country.

On a chilly spring morning in Brooklyn, 19-year-old Linda Sarsour stared at her reflection, dressed in a hijab for the first time. She saw in the mirror the woman she was growing to be—a young Muslim American woman unapologetic in her faith and her activism, who would discover her innate sense of justice in the aftermath of 9/11. Now heralded for her award-winning leadership of the Women's March on Washington, Sarsour offers a "moving memoir [that] is a testament to the power of love in action" (Michelle Alexander, author of The New Jim Crow)

Sewing Love through Quilting

Yes, we are women who cut apart perfectly good pieces of fabric, then sew them back together again! All for charity!

YOU are welcome to join us on Thursdays from 9:30AM to 1:00PM in Room 403 at church. No previous sewing or quilting experience necessary. We have sewing machines and supplies to use and many willing "teachers" to help with your first charity project. Contact Gerry Rickett or Peggy Morrison with questions (phone numbers are in church directory.)

The Green Mountain United Methodist Quilters were started 23 years ago (January 2002) by June Ryker, a GMUMC church member and a remarkable quilter who had even taught quilting internationally. Her reason for beginning this group? She wanted to use up her large "stash" of quilting fabric. We found out after she died in 2023 that her stash must have multiplied fourfold – our group was the recipient of her ENORMOUS stash, her quilting supplies/equipment, and dozens of unfinished quilts and quilt blocks. We miss June!

In the last 9 years, nearly 450 quilts made by the group have been given for:

- silent auctions for charities,
- Texas hurricane victims
- Florida shooting victims
- the Troublesome and Marshall fire victims in Colorado
- homeless shelters
- teen mother and pregnancy programs
- local medical facilities dealing with underserved people
- Children's Hospital and Denver Health
- GMUMC Youth Group mission trips (and helped them make pillowcases for foster children)
- Habitat for Humanity (when our church helps with a build, the family who moves into the house gets one or more quilts)
- Quilts of Valor (worked with Blue Spruce Chapter Daughters of the American Revolution to make red/white/blue quilts that will be given to local military veterans or those still in military service).
- Meals on Wheels were recipients of 175 placemats and 116 mug rugs for their clients.





Our scraps of fabric and batting don't go to waste either - over 500 dog/cat beds were donated to the Jefferson County Animal Shelter. Karen Schmoker has been making the cases we stuff for the beds.

Before donating them, the quilts are displayed in the sanctuary during a Sunday worship service. Unlike "hands off" at other quilt shows, we encourage the congregation to look closely at the quilts, and touch them too. It is customary for quilts to have labels showing who made them, date made, and other pertinent information. Our beautiful labels on the backs of the quilts are embroidered by Janet Starkey.

The next display of quilts is planned for Sunday, April 27.




Join us for food and fellowship before Easter services on Easter Sunday!

Life Spark Cancer Resources

LifeSpark Cancer Resources is a Colorado non-profit that uses Reiki and Healing Touch wellness therapies to bring peace and healing to individuals with cancer. Caregivers are also eligible (family members who take care of a cancer patient).

For many years GMUMC has hosted LifeSpark massage sessions in room 203 (lower north end of the west building).

LifeSpark is a free program, their wellness therapies promote peace and healing on all levels. Adults 18

and over with any type or stage of cancer are eligible to receive 8 weeks of healing sessions scheduled at a time convenient for you. You'll be matched with an experienced healing touch or Reiki provider. Sessions last about an hour. LifeSpark sessions do not replace medical care, but rather support you during and after cancer treatment.




