Window on the Hill

Mark's Musings

The month of May concludes with Memorial Day, and welcomes the unofficial start to the summer season. Memorial Day, or Decoration Day (as it was formerly known), was originally conceived to honor the graves of Civil War soldiers with flags and flowers. Evolving over time, it now honors the American deceased of all wars, complete with prayers offered in remembrance of the fallen and their ultimate sacrifice. The practice of Christian discipleship, though, goes even beyond a soldier's sacrifice in combat to a much different kind of engagement with the enemy.

Of Gods And Men is a movie about the true story of a group of Trappist monks (the marines of the various Christian monastic orders) living among an impoverished Algerian Muslim community at the end of the 20th century, trapped between a militaristic government and a band of religious-extremist guerillas, both of whom threaten their very existence. After much discussion and prayerful discernment they decide to remain rather than to flee abandoning the village people they serve and have come to love. Sadly, the consequences are dire. Most of the monks are kidnapped and murdered. As they are led away into the woods to meet their doom, the film ends with the abbot's prayer, one of the most profound Christian prayers I have ever heard. I was compelled to stop, rewind, and write it down. I have pondered it ever since. I invite you to do the same:

"Should it ever befall me—and it could happen today—to be a victim of the terrorism swallowing up all foreigners here, I would like my community, my church, my family to remember that my life was given to God and this country; that the unique Master of all life was no stranger

My death, of course, will quickly vindicate those who called me naïve or idealistic, but they must know that I will be freed of a burning curiosity, and God willing, will immerse my gaze with the Father's and contemplate with Him His children of Islam as He sees them. This 'thank you' which encompasses my entire life includes you, of course, friends of yesterday and today, and you, too, friend of the last minute, who knew not what you were doing. Yes, to you as well, I address this thank you and this farewell which you envisioned. May we meet again, happy thieves in paradise, if it pleases God, the Father of us both. Amen."



- ⇒ **2020.** Painting, repairing and outfitting the two garden sheds. Troop 989.
- ⇒ **2021.** Bee homes for solitary bees with community education. (Girl Scout Gold Award).
- ⇒ **2022.** Bat boxes. Troop 989 (no bats....yet. Bats are shy and it can take up to 5 years before bat boxes are occupied).
- ⇒ **2023.** Garden brick installation. Troop 989
- ⇒ **2024.** Revive the Hive Troop 342 built two new bee hives, a foundation, wind break and fencing for our bees.

They already have a mated queen they know and accept, so they should be fairly unnoticeable from the garden. If they are feeling cranky please let Ali know and we can schedule an inspection. Usually crankiness means

Donations for scholarship plots – Thank you for your past generosity. Two of the plots in the garden are scholarship plots. The scholarships were awarded in April. Thank you for your 2024 donations making these plots possible for 2025 gardeners. The cost to support a scholarship plot is \$50 / plot. The Cedar Hill garden has some of the lowest plot fees in the DUG network thanks to your support, this allows our community members to garden and grow food for their families.





LifeSpark Cancer Resources

LifeSpark Cancer Resources is a Colorado non-profit organization that uses Reiki and Healing Touch wellness therapies to bring peace and healing to individuals with cancer. For many years GMUMC has hosted LifeSpark massage sessions in room 203 (lower north end of the west building).

How LifeSpark Sessions Work: LifeSpark is a free program, their wellness therapies promote peace and healing on all levels. Adults 18 and over with any type or stage of cancer are eligible to receive 8 weeks of healing sessions. Caregivers are also eligible (family members who take care of a cancer patient). Sessions last about an hour. LifeSpark sessions do not replace medical care, but rather support you during and after cancer treatment. For more information or to get started contact
