Did You Know?

The church had solar panels put on the roof in 2024, paid for by GMUMC's Permanent Endowment Fund. Then, in March 2025, Xcel Energy put the church "online" so the solar panels are now generating electricity to help reduce our monthly bills.

Here's a comparison for our first three months using solar for electricity with the same time period in 2024:

	2024 Bill	<u>2025 Bill</u>
April	\$977	\$290
May	\$790	\$313
June	\$926	\$141
Total	\$2693	\$744

Difference (Savings!) = \$1949

In addition to the monthly electricity cost being lower, the church will also receive a rebate annually from Xcel for several years, and a large one-time rebate from the federal government in 2026.

Trustees will continue to monitor the solar performance.
